Lesson 5:

“God’s People for  
the World”

1. This week’s identity statement is that we are “God’s people for the world.” After thinking about the teaching in the video, What does that statement mean to you?
2. One thing that becomes readily apparent in the story in Acts is that God is fully willing to use anything and everything to make himself known... even to the point of being made fun of or misunderstood (see Acts 2:13- “They’ve had to much wine!”). What’s the craziest thing you’ve ever heard of that actually brought people to Jesus?
3. Peter’s quote from Joel (Acts 2:17-20) talks about how God will pour out his spirit on all people- no matter who they are, what their social status, how educated they are... He can and will use anyone.

Have you ever wondered whether you were qualified to be a part of “God’s people for the world?” Why?

Read Acts 4:13. What is the qualification for being a part of what God is doing in the world, according to this passage?

4. We talked about how Acts 2 would have been understood by Jewish people as an unraveling of the curses of Genesis.

Which of the “curses” resonated with you as we talked through them? Are there things you see in the world around you, in our nation, or even in your own life that deeply break your heart?

How can you, this group, or your church be a part of God’s work to break that curse?

5. Spend some time in prayer, praying specifically that God would empower you, your group, and your church to take up their identity as God’s people for the world.
